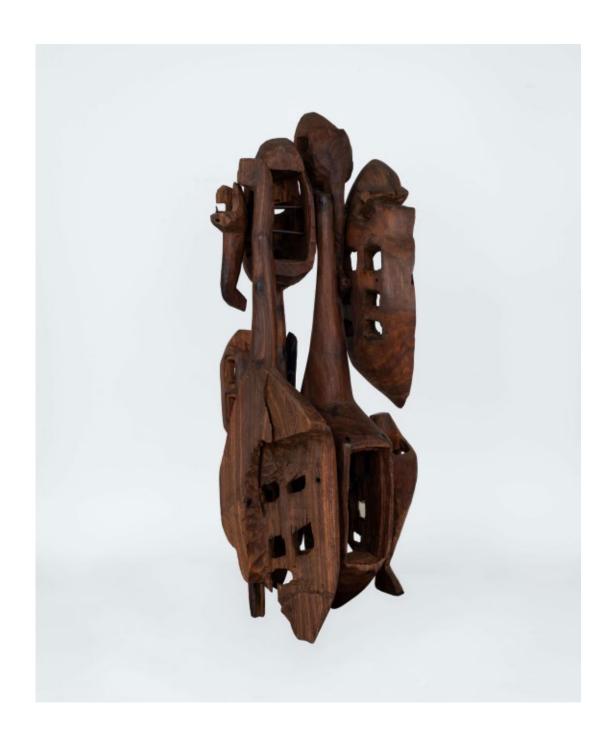

EL ANATSUI

(GHANA, B 1944)

EL ANATSUI IS THE WORLD-CLASS
INTERNATIONAL ARTIST, WHOSE BELOVED
WOODEN SCULPTURES AND MONUMENTAL
WALL-HANGINGS COMBINE TRADITIONAL
AND CONTEMPORARY TECHNIQUES, AND
ARE HELD IN THE COLLECTIONS OF
THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART
(NEW YORK), TATE MODERN (LONDON)
AND NATIONAL MUSEUM OF AFRICAN
ART (WASHINGTON DC).

ANATSUI HAS EXHIBITED WORLDWIDE,
NOTABLY A SURVEY AT HAUS DE KUNST
(MUNICH) IN 2019, AND WON A GOLDEN
LION FOR LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT
AT THE 56TH VENICE BIENNALE. HIS
WORK IS CURRENTLY ON DISPLAY AT
TATE MODERN'S TURBINE HALL.



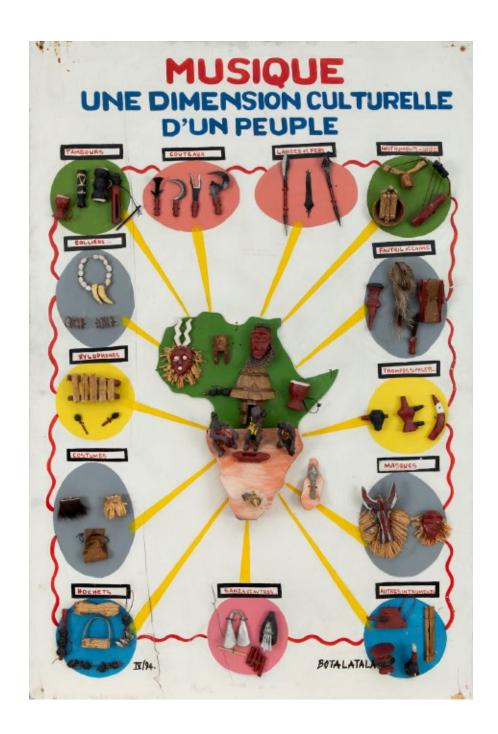

EMMANUEL BOTALATALA

(ZAIRE, B 1951)

EMMANUEL BOTALATALA IS A FORMER TEACHER AND BANK-CLERK, WHOSE ARRESTING ASSEMBLAGES AND THREEDIMENSIONAL RELIEFS SPEAK OF THE COMPLEX POLITICS AND CULTURAL LIFE WITHIN THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO. WORKING PREDOMINANTLY WITH RECYCLED MATERIALS, THE ARTIST CONSIDERS HIS ROLE AKIN TO THAT OF AN EDUCATOR AND ACTIVIST AND INTENDS TO BUILD A CULTURAL CENTRE IN KINSHASA TO HOUSE HIS LIFETIME OEUVRE.

FRÉDÉRIC BRULY BOUABRÉ

(IVORY COAST, 1923-2014)

FRÉDÉRIC BRULY BOUABRÉ WAS AN IVORIAN VISIONARY WRITER AND IMAGE-MAKER, WHOSE MANUSCRIPTS, AND ILLUSTRATIONS OF BÉTÉ FOLKLORE, TRADITIONS AND CULTURE LED HIM ON A PROPHETIC MISSION TO DOCUMENT THE ENTIRE WORLD.

BOUABRÉ'S VOLUMINOUS OUTPUT ADDRESSED HUMAN HABITS AND DESIRES, VISUAL AND SOCIAL OBSERVATIONS, AND WORLD PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS, ALL WITHIN HIS ELABORATE AND IDIOSYNCRATIC POSTCARD FORMAT. SERIES BY THE ARTIST FEATURE IN THE COLLECTIONS OF TATE MODERN (LONDON), MUSEUM OF MODERN ART (NEW YORK) AND CENTRE POMPIDOU (PARIS).

SEYNI AWA CAMARA

(SENEGAL, B 1945)

SEYNIAWA CAMARA IS THE CELEBRATED FEMALE CLAY ARTIST WHOSE MONUMENTAL FIGURATIONS REFERENCE THE MYSTICAL QUALITIES OF MOTHERHOOD IN HER COMMUNITY. HER INCLUSION IN THE LES MAGICIENS DE LA TERRE AT CENTRE POMPIDOU (PARIS) IN 1989 LED TO EXHIBITIONS WORLDWIDE,

TUNING AT THE 13TH GWANGJU BIENNALE

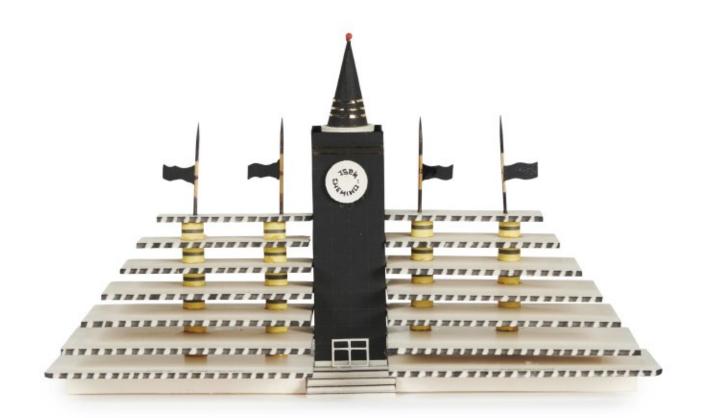

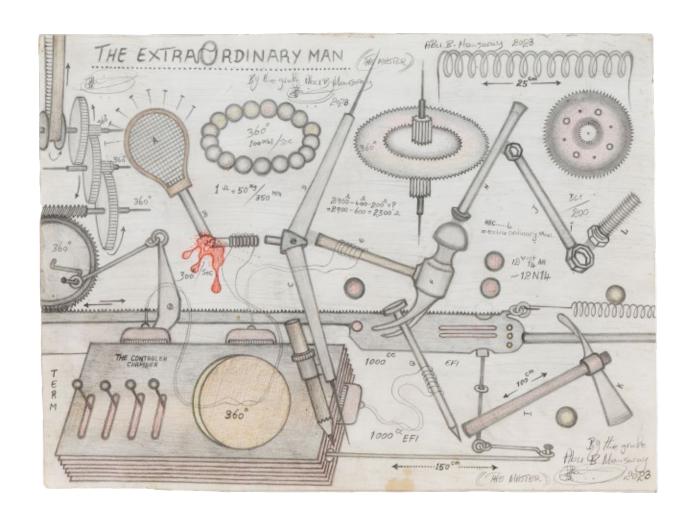

ABU BAKARR MANSARAY IS AN IMAGE-MAKER, INVENTOR AND AFRO-FUTURIST, AND A PIONEER OF CONTEMPORARY AFRICAN ART.

HIS FANTASTICAL TEXT-HEAVY DIAGRAMS HAVE BEEN EXHIBITED WORLDWIDE, INCLUDING SIMON NJAMI'S AFRICA REMIX (2004) AND OKWUI ENENZOR'S ALL THE WORLD'S FUTURES (2015), AND FEATURES IN THE COLLECTIONS OF THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART (NEW YORK), MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS (HOUSTON) AND TEL AVIV MUSEUM OF ART. HIS WORK IS CURRENTLY ON DISPLAY IN DREAM MACHINES AT DESTE FOUNDATION (HYDRA).
