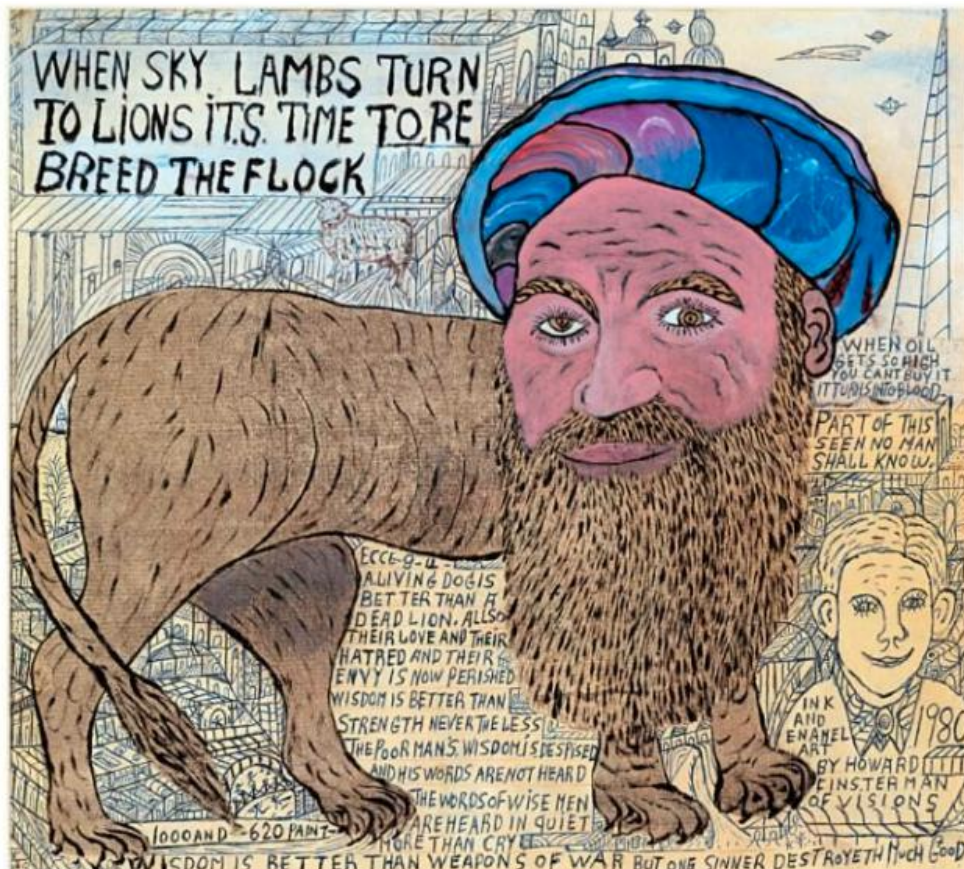


Market News: the Museum of Everything opens gallery

When the Museum of Everything, a collection of work by self-taught "outsider" artists, opened in North London 2009, there were queues around the block. Since then it has moved around, but this Sunday it opens a gallery in a former barber's shop in Marylebone, central London, where some extraordinary works will be for sale. The Gallery of Everything will show works from the Museum collection which are not for sale – it is a registered charity – but will offer works from private collections in a variety of price ranges, the profits from which will go towards supporting the Museum's wider cultural and educational activities.

The first show, for instance, will feature artists made famous by musician, Jarvis Cocker, in the Channel 4 documentary, "Journeys into the Outside", and will include paintings by the American preacher, Howard Finster, who was championed by the band, Talking Heads, priced from £3,000 to £30,000 . The Gallery will also be at Frieze Masters this year with a collection of works by artists discovered by Jean Dubuffet, the influential French artist who promoted the concept of "Art Brut". Among these are paintings by the Swiss artist, Adolf Wolfli, whom Dubuffet found in a clinic in Switzerland and whose works are priced from £50,000 to £150,000.
